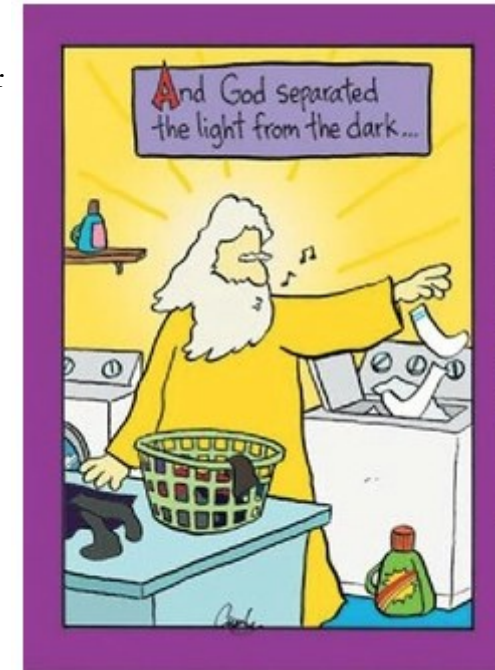

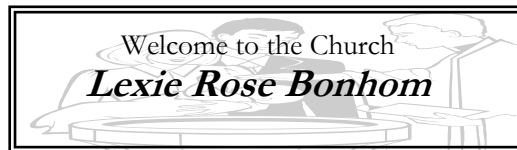
40 Hour Famine News

Solomon's Interest

I am seeking expressions of interest from people to join me as part of a Parish team to go to The Solomon Islands later this year.

The cost is approx. \$2,200 which includes all airfares, travel costs, all accommodation and all food costs in the Solomon Islands.

The trip will be from the 21st of September to the 7th of October.

The trip will be from Orange to Canberra to Brisbane to Honiara to Santa Ysabel and then return.

Why do we go – to build a greater understanding of Worship, to have fellowship with Anglican Christians in a Developing Nation, and to support through training programs, Rotary RAWCS programs and as a church financial assistance for community centres and disaster recovery programs.

Where do we stay and what do we do when there: **We stay in Buala Community Centre and do some of the following activities:** Bible Study;

Training leaders in small group ministry; Family video night (*on the big screen*); Soccer clinics; Preaching and Teaching (in English); Prayer ministry; Bible study classes for women; conversational literacy program; Women's ministry (including craft, sewing, cooking etc) Cultural experiences – craft exhibitions, dance & pipes; experience a range of worship; Village visits; School visits; picnic on a tropical island and fishing (more like chasing the fish in a canoe and not catching any).

It is a wonderful time of Christian fellowship and experience of that Fellowship in a developing nation. I would encourage everybody to pray and come and talk to me about coming along this year or for future years.

Who should come? Everyone who can, you need to have a reasonable level of fitness and willingness to serve God in this way. There is training provided and a covenant agreement to sign and engage with, but I encourage anyone who is able to come and willing to serve God to come.
