In a Traditional Anglican Worship Service, the prayers of the people came from the people. Why? Why not just have them come from the Lay minister at the front?

Because the prayers of the people are an integral part of the worship that we are led into to do.

When we come to prayer it is important that it is the expression of those within the worship service and the condition of their hearts because of where they have been led in the worship.

It's about the place we are at and what we know we need to bring before God as a voice for his people and the rest of the world as Christ's lights to the world. It's about inclusion and the necessity of having a voice in one of the most important parts of our Worship together.

You have been led into the presence of God, that comes with worship, and now you are going to express what God has done for you and those around you, how you can love your neighbour as yourself, how you can serve and honour God and His kingdom, and how you become an agent of light and life in the wider community of God.
