National Trust of Australia (NSW) Holy Trinity Church Orange Conservation Appeal (Appeal)

Many thanks to those who donated to the June 2017 Appeal. The Appeal now has \$160,000 in a joint Westpac Bank account with the National Trust. A recent estimate indicates that at least \$350,000 will be required to reslate the main roof. Other areas have been reslated.

A Trinity Foundation meeting was held on 31 July 2017 at which Bishop Ian Palmer was present as well as our Heritage Conservation Architect – James Nicholson. A wide range of Diocese and Parish matters were discussed and Bishop Ian wholly supports the Appeal.

Bishop Ian fully recognises the significance to Holy Trinity Orange of the sale of the Bluestone Hall.

Bishop Ian said that Holy Trinity Orange is an historic church, a sacred space set aside for the worship of God in Christ and that makes a very important spiritual statement to the community.

The meeting recognised that it was critical some restoration work be carried out on the slate roof.

It was agreed that Ernest Shave should liaise with James Nicholson with a view to contacting the slating contractor and ask him to visit Orange to provide a full report on the state of the roof and set out what options are available.
