## From the Rector,

There were two really important meetings in our parish last week.

A small group has been established to help plan and coordinate the 8:30 am service.

This service has a strong liturgical framework, using different Eucharistic services each week. Music is mostly chosen from "Together in Song", the successor to the "Australian Hymnbook". The Bible readings follow the three-year Revised Common Lectionary, an international and ecumenical compilation used by many mainstream denominations, and come from the "New Revised Standard Version" of the Bible.

How can this group enrich and enhance the strong existing framework? All our worship must have a mission edge, as well as seek to build community. Central to our worship is the resurrection proclamation that "we are the Body of Christ". Building and maintaining a sense of belonging and pastoral care are other important aspects for discussion.

On Friday night, the Pastoral Carers' Group closed. It began life some years ago as "Pastoral Partners", and sought to maintain pastoral and prayerful bonds for people within the worshipping life of the parish. It has been adapted over the years,

but participation and leadership has dwindled. It served its season well.

Thank you to Lynne Middleton who was its coordinator and inspirer from the beginning. Lynne is now examining ways through which pastoral contact can be maintained, particularly with those who are shut in, over the telephone.

We should always remember that as a community of Christ, we have an obligation to support and care for one another.

Give thanks for the many gifts that we have in our parish life and pray that we may also have the gifts and courage to look beyond ourselves, as a community which serves the mission of God. As the Diocesan Mission Statement puts it:

"We acknowledge ourselves to be followers of Christ who are God's 'ones who have been sent', called to be messengers and agents of God's mission in and to the world."


### **ABM Reflection**
