Our Identity as Anglicans

One of the great things that is a mark of our distinctiveness as Anglican Christians today is what is culturally called our Worship.

Our worship entails, prayers of praise, confession, humility, joyfulness, sorrow, and attention to the greatness of God. We have at the very heart of our worship services the scriptures, the creeds, the Lord's Prayer, words of encouragement and the Psalms.

If you were to ask yourself though what was the key factor, the key part, of our worship, what would you say it was? Personally I believe it is about 'communion'; not the sacramental part necessarily, but the gathering together of a group of believers in unity of purpose – to Glorify God.

Jesus gathered people together; the early church started in such a way that people got together and walked together as they learnt to worship God. Now this wasn't easy then and isn't easy now. With different personalities, cultures, and interpretations of what church is to be like and how we should behave in Church, it can be very difficult to gather with people around you who are different. Let alone people you don't necessarily like or want to know.

The wonderful thing about the first chapter of Ephesians, as I said in my last week's sermon, is about "becoming who you already are in Christ" When we meet Christ, He meets us, and things change. What we need to understand is that "we are becoming" not that we are already perfect in Christ!

This means that in our Worship Services where we gather together, we are all a work in progress. We will all love different parts of the same thing. We will all have issues to deal with, whether struggling with forgiveness and trust at different times with people in our gathering and beyond or many, many other issues. The point is that as Anglicans we have this wonderful gift of "Worship Services", where we can come together, in what I call 'our brokenness', be accepted as broken, and then worship together in unity.

We worship as a people in unison, not as the same. The distinction is important because it helps us to respect each other as we worship in different ways and as we come together working out our lives as Christians.

Just remember, we are all "becoming who we already are in Christ", we are all working towards that goal and we are doing it together in His Grace.

God Bless us all in this Journey.
