### From the Rector:

Over recent months, there has been significant change in the day to day life of our parish community.

The 7:30am and 9:30 am congregations have amalgamated to form a new service at 9.00am. A new service has commenced at 10.30am in the Memorial Hall. Now that we are "back in the church", life is beginning to settle into a more regular pattern. Last Tuesday, Morning Prayer was said in the Chapel. The reredos screen is standing in the chapel aisle at the moment because the back wall needs to dry out.

Please remember that all our services are invitational. Part of our duty as a community of faith is to invite others into worship so that they might deepen (even begin) a relationship with God.

There is also a need for diversity in our services. The 10.30am Wednesday morning service meets in the Choir Vestry and follows a traditional order of service, including hymns. On Saturday evenings at 5:30pm, the service generally used is the Second Order of Holy Communion, without any hymns at all.

On Sundays, the 9.00am Holy Communion service will use a mixture of Second Order, Third Order and the Liturgy Commission's 2009 service. At 10:30am, the Praise, Prayer and

Proclamation Service is used on three Sundays. On the third Sunday, Holy Communion is celebrated.

A review meeting is planned for 8 September at 10.30am.

May I remind you of the Bishop's visit on 2, 3, 4 August, and an informal gathering which we are calling "Pizza Church" on July 26. Please book now so that catering arrangements can be made. These are both opportunities to which friends and family can be invited.

May I encourage you strongly to continue in your prayer for the parish as we find our way into these changes so that together, we may grow in the grace of God. Today's Gospel reading ask us to think about who is our neighbour. Perhaps you might like to think about a neighbour and invite them into worship.

### ABM Reflection

Amos 7: 7-17; Psalm 82;

Colossians 1: 1-14; Luke 10: 25-37

God's justice is disturbing, requiring that we truly love God and our neighbour. As the prophecy against Jeroboam and the psalm show, God's standards are high, demanding absolute justice for the "little ones" of the world. Paul makes it clear that salvation does not relieve us of this obligation, but enables us to "live lives worthy of the Lord" and "bear fruit in every good work" (v 10).

**Today's question:** How often is the love I show an expression of God's fierce justice?

Prayer: Teach me, O Lord, what it means to love with the fire of your love.

Give thanks for the work of Anglican Witness - the Anglican Communion's evangelism and Church growth initiative.
