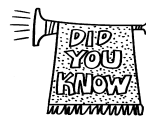
Today's question: Stopping still is tough. Waiting for God makes for endless minutes. Why stop and why wait? Who am I waiting for?

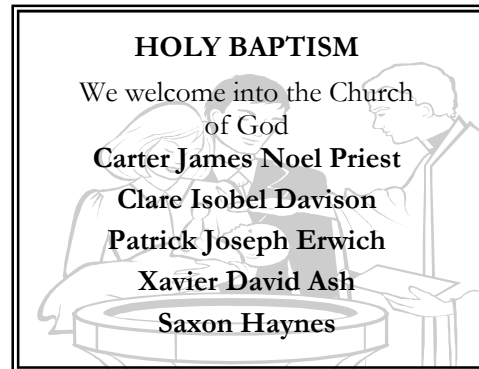
